About the 2016 WTF World Taekwondo Junior Championships

The World Taekwondo Junior Championships is one of the top events for the World Taekwondo Federation (WTF), the international body governing the sport. Burnaby won the bid against Turkey to host the 2016 WTF World Junior Championships. Athletes from more than 100 countries will gather at the Bill Copeland Sports Centre for the five-day competition taking place from November 16 to 20, 2016. Both male and female athletes, between the ages of 14 and 17, will be competing in 10 divisions. Medals in various weight divisions will be awarded each evening.
